

Reception Summer 1 BINGO homework

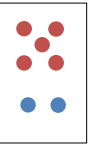
Practise writing your tricky words from your orange book:

Phase 2: **I, is, as, to, into, the, no, go, and, has, his, her, he, we, be, me, she, of, see, Kipper**

Phase 3: **you, all, are, my, by, they, was, bear, sure, pure**

Phase 4: **said, so, have, like, some, come, love, do, were, here, little, says, there, when, what, one, out, today**

Remember to form your letters correctly.

Do something at home that you know is a good way to be healthy – write about it or take a photograph.	Look at a clock, find out what time you get up, eat lunch, go to bed etc. (Focus on o'clock times) Write and draw a diary of your day.	Bring in a photograph of you as a baby (we can scan them and give them back), write and draw about how you have changed.	Draw, write or use objects to show all of the ways you can think of to make 7 7 is made of 5 and 2, 5 and 2 make 7 $7=5+2$ $5+2=7$ 
Look around your home for things you can control . (e.g switch off/on, change volume, programme in some way) Draw pictures to record what you have found.	Go to the library to find and read, a story book or an information book about plants. Come and tell a member of staff all about it.	Plant the sunflower seeds and as they grow draw some pictures of their development. When they grow really tall decide the best way to measure them.	Practice writing some of your tricky words correctly in sentences.

All children to complete the blue **square**. Select other activities, aim for one a week, up to the May holidays. Please **sign and date a square when activity is completed and encourage your child to let a member of staff know when they have brought it to school**. Children should aim to complete at least 4 activities, there will be a small reward for those children who do.

Remember to keep practising numbers, reading, phonics sounds and tricky word recognition for 10 minutes every day – and let us know what you've been up to in the home-school reading record, and you can always work on our phonics games at 'Lexia' to earn certificates.
